the people who are online right now. We also want to bring the message across, that being a lesbian is fun, cool and something to be really proud of :-)

How did you come up with the idea for your site?

We met over the internet (of course *g*) in 1997. Before that, we both had trouble finding our way into the lesbian community. We felt that, everybody already knew each other. We would walk past bars and not dare go in like so many lesbians out there. And since it was so easy to get to know each other over the internet, we decided we wanted to offer something to lesbians to make it easier for them too, to get to know other women. So on the very first evening we met in reality, the idea for SHOE was born and 2 weeks later it went online. First it was just a local mailinglist but it grew pretty fast, soon even people from other countries subscribed to the mailinglist. In March 1999 SHOE became international.

When did you first go online?

Sunci: The first time I went online was beginning of 1996. I went to an internet cafe to look up a site a friend of mine had done. I was immediately hooked. About 6 months later I started to work in an internet cafe. This meant non-stop surfing and learning.

Fab: I first went online in the States in the summer of 1995 where someone was looking up some clubs and bars in Hawaii for me. But to be honest, I didn't really have a clue what the internet was. It wasn't until 1996 when I started using it at work.

What would you tell other women and girls who are interested in going or publishing online?

JUST DO IT! The internet is a place where women have the same chances as men. So, take it - do it. It can be very (!) time consuming but the rewards all well worth it. Take some classes, learn how to do it, start perfecting it and be proud of yourself :-)
